GLOBAL AIRLINE TRAINING PROVIDER, CTC AVIATION SIGNS CO-OPERATION AGREEMENT WITH LITHUANIAN FLYLAL TRAINING FOR AIRCREW TRAINING AND SUPPLY

CTC Aviation Group plc and flyLAL Training have announced plans to work together to provide high quality, cost effective aircrew training solutions in Lithuania. At a ceremony held on 28 February 2008 at the flyLAL Training offices in Vilnius, Lithuania, CTC's Chief Executive Officer Captain Rob Clarke and flyLAL Training's Managing Director Arūnas Kmieliauskas signed a framework agreement establishing the terms for future co-operation between the two companies, encompassing the training and supply of flight deck and cabin crew.



Captain Clarke said "We are very pleased to be announcing our plans to work in conjunction with flyLAL Training. This agreement will allow our companies to co-operate effectively on a wide range of initiatives of mutual interest. flyLAL Training has extensive aviation-related experience, capabilities and infrastructure and will be a very welcome partner in CTC's future activities."

According to the framework agreement, flyLAL Training and CTC will identify areas of mutual interest and seek to develop co-operative programmes and projects for the supply of pilots and cabin crew as well as the delivery of high quality training courses and other activities to support airlines within Europe and Russia.

The initial stage of this co-operation has been the sale of a Boeing 737 300/400/500 full flight simulator from CTC to flyLAL Training; this simulator will be the first of its kind in Lithuania. "Until now, only theoretical knowledge training was offered for pilots in Lithuania. Practical skills could only be acquired by travelling abroad" Arūnas Kmieliauskas said. "We look forward to working with CTC and aim in the near future to be able to offer all the necessary aircrew qualifications and skills from one centre in Lithuania".

The simulator is due to be relocated from CTC's Crew Training Centre - Nursling, Southampton (UK) during summer 2008 and CTC plans to announce a decision on a replacement device shortly. CTC is one of Europe's largest and most capable third party airline training providers and a global leader in commercial pilot training from ab-initio through to command and instructor courses. During 2007 the company trained over 1200 pilots for 52 airlines worldwide. The agreement with flyLAL Training is in accordance with CTC's ongoing commitment to diversification and global expansion through 2008.
