Overview

CTC's Instructor Rating course is quality focused. CTC understands that the fundamentals of flight training are imperative for ensuring that a proper foundation is in place for advanced training to flourish. CTC's Instructor Course emphasizes the importance of visual attitude flying and the importance of getting the technique right, rather than focusing on training to meet a tolerance. If the technique is right, then in time, the tolerance will reduce. Alongside this, the CTC Instructor Course fully integrates over 120 hours of ground tuition which includes workshops, power point briefs, white board briefs and the integration of instructional technique theory. Finally, the course looks to develop in each instructor a desire for a holistic approach to pilot training where safety awareness, critical thinking, sound judgment and Threat and Error management are fully integrated into the training objectives.

Prerequisites for NZ C Cat Instructors Rating.

Prior to commencing the C Cat Instructors rating course, all trainees must have a current NZ CPL (A), Class 1 NZ medical and at least 150 hours pilot in command (PIC) flight time.

Furthermore, the instructional techniques course must be completed before commencement of C Cat training. CTC is able to facilitate the 4 day instructional techniques course if required.

CTC is also able to provide an aircraft at a reduced rate for building PIC hours. Approximately 1 month would be required to complete the full 50 hours PIC post CPL(A).

Prerequisites for JAR Flight Instructors (FI) Rating.

Prior to commencing the JAR FI Instructors rating course, all trainees must have a current JAR CPL (A), JAR Class 1 medical and completed 5 hours SE flying in the previous six months.

For those candidates dual qualified i.e. who hold both a NZ and JAR CPL and meet the requirements stated above, CTC is able to provide the required training to dual qualify applicants for both the JAR and NZ Instructors Rating.

Course Details.

NZ C Cat Instructors Rating.

The NZ C Cat Course runs for 10 weeks and includes 120 hours of ground tuition, 28.5 hours dual

instruction, 6 hours of mutual training in a simulator and 1.5 hours for the flight test.

The course will run from Monday to Friday each week, 08:30am—17:00pm with the possibility of flying on a weekend if required if flying is disrupted due to weather. Dual flight training is fully integrated with ground school theory and additional dual hours are available if required.

JAR Flight Instructors (FI) Rating.

The JAR FI Instructors Course runs for 13 weeks and includes 120 hours of ground tuition, 39 hours dual instruction, 10 hours of mutual training, and 1.5 hours for the flight test.

All CTC Instructor Courses are supervised by an A Cat instructor and carried out by either senior B Cats (in training to be A Cats) or A Cat Instructors.

Instructor Employment with CTC.

CTC trains instructors to the highest standard. Our syllabus is constructed to ensure that all required competencies are comprehensively trained, both theoretical and practical. Our course hours are set above the minimum requirements to enhance proficiency.
